### DON'T PUT IT OFF!

As I worked on the material that followsespecially the part from ROY H. CHAPMAN's work and having experienced the loss of my first parent just last month I am bound to remind you about something.

One of the best sources, if not THE best, is the older generation- especially our parents and grandparents. My grandparents were long gone when I became interested in my family history. My parents were still living but had never really gotten into the subject. I never could interest my dad to do more than answer a few direct questions or tell a little legend from time to time and then his mind began to wonder - he became disoriented and I'd gotten all I was going to from him. At 92 he still lives but is of no use in this regard.

My mother had a bear-trap mind, knew a lot about my dad's family and a great deal about hers. I picked her brain on a number of occasions but never did get it all. I just never went to the trouble to take along a tape recorder and spend a lot of time with her on the subject. She was always willing and always had something to offer but I did not do my part. For the past many months she has not been well and I was reluctant to even ask the more simple family history questions.

I cut you short on inquiries or items in the Chapman Exchange in the last issue. I've tried to make up for it in this one. You will notice a slight change in format. In the past I have oriented the inquiry to the Chappie, listing them in approximate Chappie order with the Chappies name and address at the beginning of the item. I'm grasping for help in figuring out a way to keep up with the overwhelming amount of Chapman information that I have. I think this new ancestor orientation will help. All of the same information about the Chappie or Chappies is at the end of the item. The inquiry number, which you probably don't pay much attention to anyway, is slipped off to the right side at the beginning of the inquiry.

In most past issues I've tried to include most of the Chapman ancestors mentioned in the exchange in the Chapman Biographical Reference (CBR). Since the CBR in this issue is more or less dedicated to Georgia Chapmans, and was actually prepared before the exchange was written, you won't find most of the Chapman ancestors mentioned here in the CBR. Look for them later.

I still have an unbelievable backlog of inquiries so look for an ever larger exchange in the next issue which I promise you will have before summer is over.

Although ADONIJAH CHAPMAN and the Chappie, Edward C. McKinney have been mentioned in at least four different issues of the newsletter (see #22 pg 17, #23 pg 23, #24 pg 19 and # 18 pg 11) I have never done an *inquiry* as such and my computer system will not let me rest when I don't have a numbered inquiry registered for each Chappie- particularly subscribers.

One reason an inquiry was never published is that we thought we found the connections thus negating the need for an inquiry. Although there is a tentative connection further review of the record does show an inquiry is needed - proving again that the computer is smarter than I am.

We estimate that ADONIJAH
CHAPMAN was born about 1756 in
Connecticut. Information received from Chappie
Mike Morgan shows that an Adonijah Chapman
was the son of RUFUS CHAPMAN and Lucy
HUNTLEY. From all indications this branch
descends from WILLIAM CHAPMAN who was
born in England, by our estimate about 1633,
and came to New London, Connecticut.
Chappie John M. Chapman's recent
compilation on this branch shows all of this.

Ed shows that Adonijah married a person named "Sabra" but Mike's source showed the wife to be "Rachel." We need help in resolving this spouse.

### AMASA CHAPMAN 1771 Connecticut

AMASA CHAPMAN was born June 29, 1771 in Ashford, Windham, Connecticut. He dled March 21, 1847 in Marcellus, Onondaga County, New York. He married Lydia HUNT May 6, 1804 in Marcellus. Lydia was born March 9, 1780 and died April 13, 1849 in Marcellus.

In <u>CHAPMAN CHATTER #21</u> I published a compilation of all the known Chapman descendants of **WILLIAM**CHAPMAN born 1651-56 in England. It was not my compilation - rather that of Chappies
Dian Gustafson, Keith W. Chapman, Nancy
A. Burton and others.

In that compilation one of the dead ends was the above described AMASA CHAPMAN. At that time we had less information than is shown above. Chappie John M. Chapman has been able to add his line to that. He sent family group records on the following additional Chapmans. JACOB CHAPMAN 1818, ARTHUR VANDERBURGH CHAPMAN 1847, MARSHALL HUNT CHAPMAN 1880, ARTHUR EDWARD CHAPMAN 1907, EMMA ELIZABETH CHAPMAN NORMAN 1909, and JOHN MARSHALL CHAPMAN 1917.

Several events dictate this piece. Many of you read the article on JOSEPH CHAPMAN written by Phil Elisworth in CHAPMAN CHATTER #27 Fall 1991. In this article he proved that Joseph was a descendant of EDWARD CHAPMAN rather than WILLIAM

CHAPMAN. If you are a descendant of JOSEPH CHAPMAN (1682-1725) then you should consider yourself to be a descendant of EDWARD CHAPMAN (1642-1678) of Ipswich, MA, and not a descendant of WILLIAM CHAPMAN (1633E-1699) of New London, CT. I'm reluctant to up and change your lineage without your approval or direction. If your's needs to be changed in our records please advise me.

As you may know there were two EDWARD CHAPMAN publications in the last century. One was published in Portland, ME in 1878 and was published showing that the compilers were REV. JACOB CHAPMAN and Dr. W. B. Lapham. Then in Concord, NH in 1898 another version was published by JACOB CHAPMAN. Somewhere I got the impression that Rev. Jacob did not appreciate the earlier version going to press.

I have spent some time trying to get the basic vital statistics from these genealogies in the computer. I still have much work to do. I wanted to mention it here to solicit your assistance in obtaining additional information pertaining to this branch of the family. It's been a hundred years since these publications and you'd be surprised just how little I have to add to that.

One Chapple that we are hoping can help is George Chapman Beavis who wrote once- "My mother was a Chapman descended from Edward of Ipswich. I have in my possession some original Chapman Bible records that have never been published. For the last few years I have been working on consolidating my grandfather's work - a lot of which has been lost."

We are hoping George will share this with us.

For almost a year and a half I've had a project in suspense or backlog to publish information on the families of two Chappies who found themselves connected through the newsletter. Their names and addresses are at the end of the sketch for JOHN LEE CHAPMAN below. See also SIMPSON WILLIAM CHAPMAN below. This sketch on Elmer, who is not in either of their direct lines is a bonus.

We estimate that ELMER LEE
CHAPMAN was born about 1890, the son of
JAMES MONROE CHAPMAN and Jennie C.
BRITTON. He was born in McNairy County,
Tennessee. He died October 21, 1970 in
Lawrence County, Tennessee where he is
buried in the Dobbins Cemetery near Appleton.

Elmer married Mary Elizabeth
CROWDER who was born 1895 and died
February 1988 in Lawrence County. She too is
buried in Dobbins Cemetery.

Their children were BERNICE
CHAPMAN, September 12, 1913 who married
Lawrence (Bill) BAILEY; MILDRED LOUISE
CHAPMAN, March 19, 1915 who married
William Kenneth (Jack) COUCH June 6, 1934;
JAMES MONROE CHAPMAN, JR., March 8,
1921 who married Velma SHELTON; MARY
FRANCES CHAPMAN, April 19, 1923 September 9, 1941; BILL CHAPMAN, April 8,
1925 who married Louise HENDRIX; ROBERT
THOMAS CHAPMAN, January 22, 1927 who
married Juanita PRICE; and PAUL CHAPMAN,
April 1929 who married Betty BROWN.

# HARRIET CHAPMAN ELLIS ca 1834 Ohio

Though we have published comments from J. E. Ellis before [see CC #23 pg 32 and #26 pg 21] we have never done an inquiry as such. The absence of an inquiry for any Chappie, much less a subscriber, causes my

Chapman computer system some discomfort.
Here's one that's a couple of years late. Mr.
Ellis has been very patient. Maybe you can help
him- especially you Ohio Chapman experts.

HARRIET CHAPMAN was born about 1834 in Ohio. We know practically nothing about her. She first appears in the 1850 census of Louisa County, Iowa where she was enumerated twice. First-living in the household of a Nepolian B. Jones and then as the wife of 22 year old Benjamin ELLIS who was born in Tennessee [census "day" in 1850 was June 1 but that does not mean the enumeration was completed on that date]. Harriet and Benjamin were married there June 21, 1850. Listed in their household was JEREMIAH CHAPMAN born about 1838 in Ohio.

Nearby was JAMES C. CHAPMAN born about 1827 in Ohio in the household of Joshua Marshall and MADISON CHAPMAN born about 1835 in Ohio living with David A. Herron.

A pretty good case can be made for these four to be siblings- probably orphans.

Benjamin Ellis died July 4, 1863, of wounds from the Civil War. He had enlisted from Vinton, Benton County, Iowa. It was there that Mr. Ellis found a record where HARRIET P. ELLIS married Joseph Haines November 1, 1882. [Was this our Harriet Chapman Ellis?]

There is a possibility that HARRIET CHAPMAN was related to another Chapman of that part of Iowa. See JOHN CHAPMAN 1797 Virginia below.

[A short genealogy of this family was published in <u>CHAPMAN LINEAGES VOL I</u> 1991, page 58. The genealogy only has 25 Chapmans listed and we would like very much to add to that. We have noted an error/omission which is described below. Our main concern with this inquiry though is to learn something of the parents of **JOHN CHAPMAN**. Actually my attention was brought to this family by a Prodigy message and some other Chapman needs which I'll not get into in this issue except to respond to a much earlier comment.]

JOHN CHAPMAN was born about 1755, probably in Virginia, married Elizabeth JONES October 19, 1796 in Orange County, North Carolina and died 1838, probably in Mississippi. That's the information on the ancestor of, and as reported by, Chapple Jay Michael Richardson. The following is an excerpt from his letter. "... I have absolutely no information farther back than JOHN CHAPMAN, 1755. I believe his father to be SOLOMAN CHAPMAN, of Chatham County, North Carolina. The reason being I believe he was a Quaker and their only church was in Orange County. I only have one reference to a SOLOMAN CHAPMAN, from the Book "Tennessee Cousin" on page 400. It talks about DAVID CHAPMAN, SOLOMAN CHAPMAN, and TABITHA CHAPMAN were all living, and the heads of families in 1790, Chatham County, North Carolina.' Any and all information on this line will be welcome from fellow Chapmans. . . . "

Jay descends through the son of JOHN CHAPMAN- DANIEL JONES CHAPMAN, born 1808 in North Carolina and died December 1857 in Batesville, Arkansas. In the genealogy mentioned above we show very briefly that DANIEL JONES CHAPMAN, who was a doctor, married Lucretia Sprigg REDMON, a widow, in 1808 and dropped the line there. This was based on Elsie Chapman Edmond's JOHN CHAPMAN of Spotsylvania County.

Virginia THOMAS POWE of Cheraw, South
Carolina and Related Families, 1971. Jay had
informed us that DANIEL JONES CHAPMAN
had a son named FRANCIS SPRIGG
CHAPMAN born 1842 in Bateville, Arkansas,
married January 1, 1871 in Susanville, CA
Jenny OAKS and died in California in 1900.
Their daughter MARGARET ISABELL
CHAPMAN, born 1873 was Jay's grandmother.
[More detail on Jay's lineage is available in
Chapman Lineages, CHAPMAN CHATTER #23,
page 10.]

Jean Beckham, a Chappie who has been with us from the beginning, is also a descendant of this JOHN CHAPMAN. She shows John's birth as 1775 and from her data we see that Elizabeth JONES, the wife of John, was born October 4, 1776 and died September 3, 1825.

Jean descends through the son
ANDREW JACKSON CHAPMAN born
October 7, 1814 in Nashville, Davidson County,
TN. He married Maria Elizabeth BARTON in
1834 and died May 6, 1871 in Hinds County,
Mississippi.

In the introductory paragraph I mentioned a recent Prodigy message and a response. Jay speculated on the possibility of JOHN CHAPMAN being the son of SOLOMAN CHAPMAN and mentioned DAVID CHAPMAN and Tabitha. Chappie Velma Winn is looking for information on this DAVID CHAPMAN. "I need to find where my DAVID CHAPMAN came from. He died in Chatham Co. NC 1779 his wife was Tabitha HILL d/o Robert. chn. were sons: ABNER CHAPMAN, SOLOMAN CHAPMAN, JOHN CHAPMAN, DAVID CHAPMAN, DEBERRA CHAPMAN and BENJAMIN CHAPMAN daus, were CHARITY CHAPMAN and ELURANAH CHAPMAN...." She has a copy of John Chapman's will. It seems that most, if not all, of this family moved on to Georgia. We are working with a number of others on this family now and will report more in a future issue.

Peggy Dekker is another Chappie, cousin of Jay's, who has contributed information

on this branch.

### JOHN CHAPMAN 1797 Virginia

This is one of the ultimate Chapman ancestors of one of our Chappies (see below) and a possible relative of another- (see HARRIET CHAPMAN 1834 Ohio above).

JOHN CHAPMAN was born February 11, 1797 in Virginia and he died January 25, 1875 In Iowa where he is burled in Grandview. Nothing is known at this time about his parents.

He married Mary REEVES who was born December 11, 1796 in New York and died December 31, 1871 in Grandview.

Their known children were PHOEBE
JANE CHAPMAN September 5, 1815; JOHN
REEVES CHAPMAN March 4, 1818; ALLAN
CHAPMAN and ALBERT CHAPMAN twins
born November 6, 1819; ALFRED CHAPMAN
June 28, 1828; HANNAH EVELINE
CHAPMAN born August 20, 1828 Ohlo - died
1907 - married Josiah Elvis EAKS December
1850 [great grandmother of Niola Chapman
Pumphrey]; BENJAMIN FRANKLIN

CHAPMAN September 1, 1830; HENRY
YOUNG CHAPMAN October 4, 1832; LAKEN
CHAPMAN November 18, 1834; MADISON
GREEN CHAPMAN November 16, 1836
Indiana; and CHARLES WESLEY CHAPMAN
September 17, 1839 Indiana - December 24,
1916 who married Nancy J. CHASTEEN. Five
other children died in childhood.

This family apparently had left Ohio by the time HARRIET CHAPMAN and her suspected siblings were born but they were there just a few years before and they went to the same county in lowa. Is there a connection between some other member of the family - yet unknown and Harriet?

See the comments for ELMER LEE CHAPMAN above and SIMPSON WILLIAM CHAPMAN below. We need more information on this branch from the two Chappies listed at the end of this sketch or any others out there who can help. We would like to update our genealogy on this branch for publication in a future Chapman lineage volume.

JOHN LEE CHAPMAN was born about 1818 in Tennessee and he died before 1880 in Giles County, Tennessee. We know nothing about his parents and that is the main purpose of this piece- to find out from you. He was buried on a farm at Lynnville, Giles County, Tennessee.

John Lee married Nancy BARNETT about 1839- probably in Giles County. She was born about 1817 in Tennessee and dled after 1880 also being buried on a farm near Lynnville.

Their children, all born in Giles County, Tennessee, were MATILDA CHAPMAN ca

1841; CALVIN CHAPMAN ca 1843; MARY F. CHAPMAN ca 1845; SARAH A. CHAPMAN ca 1847; SIMPSON WILLIAM CHAPMAN born June 3 1850 - died January 18 1929 - married Susan Jane MOORE [see below]; MARGARET CHAPMAN ca 1852; JAMES MONROE CHAPMAN born October 20, 1856 - died August 26, 1923 - married (1) Jennie BRITTON and (2) Nancy Daisy RAINS; and WILLIAM THOMAS CHAPMAN ca 1860.

### JOHN GRAVES CHAPMAN 1836 Connecticut

In this instance we are not seeking information on the ancestry of a Chapman. For this person we are interested in learning all we can about his Chapman descendants. JOHN GRAVES CHAPMAN is a descendant of ROBERT CHAPMAN born 1616 in England. Rev F. W. CHAPMANS 1854 book on the Chapman family does a fine job of documenting the branch from Robert down to John Graves. Chappie Harry L. Chapman has provided us several family group sheets documenting his part of the remaining segment from John down to Harry. We now have most of the Chapmans from the 1854 book in our computer compilation. We want to extend that data which was published almost 140 years ago. Considering our extensive Chapman network, the overwhelming amount of Chapman information we have and the resources available to researchers today we have surprisingly little to add to the 1854 compilation. It is probable that many of the missing connections we have in our

records today will eventually the in with this branch of the family.

IF YOU HAVE ANYTHING TO ADD TO THE DESCENDANTS OF JOHN GRAVES CHAPMAN - OR ROBERT 1616 - THEN NOW IS THE TIME TO SUBMIT THEM SO WE CAN PUT THEM IN THE COMPUTER GENEALOGY.

JOHN GRAVES CHAPMAN was born August 22, 1836 In New Haven Connecticut. He was the son of JEDEDIAH CHAPMAN and Martha FARNHAM / FARNUM. John died October 5 1915 in East Haven, Connecticut. He is buried in the Grove Street Cemetery in New Haven. In 1860 he was identified as a "Ship Captain."

John married Henrietta ROSSITER September 9, 1861 in Clinton, Connecticut. Henrietta was born in Clinton in 1839 and she died February 25, 1923 in East Haven. She too is burled in Grove Cemetery.

Their children were JEANNIE
ROSSITER CHAPMAN January 13, 1864;
ALICE L. CHAPMAN December 1, 1865 who
married Harrie R. BESSIE; GRACE F.
CHAPMAN who married Henry G. SIMON
September 12, 1899; HARRY WILCOX
CHAPMAN May 4, 1874 - March 31, 1903 who
married Sarah Frances HYDE.

I thought I was keeping all of you advised of the key connections as I learned of them but I see a significant failure now. For some time Chappie John M. Chapman has been working to update the compilation of the descendants of WILLIAM CHAPMAN born by our estimate 1633 in England. I just received and reviewed a copy of this compilation. About a year ago we "met" Chappie John Henderson on Prodigy. John, who lives "on the spot" In Connecticut, and is something of an authority on the family provided us information from his files and I thought I'd put them in touch with one another.

John Chapman has promised to update this genealogy again if there is justification and there seems to be enough additions in John Henderson's data to justify it. On the chance that some others will have something to add I want to emphasize here the point at which John Chapman's data dies out and John Henderson's continues.

I'll leave it to these two Chappies to get together on this now, but if John Henderson wants me to photocopy what he sent me for John Chapman I'll be happy to do so. It is possible though that they can make a transfer on computer disk.

[As I reviewed John M. Chapman's genealogy of WILLIAM CHAPMAN, 1633 I discovered another Chappie I failed to tell him about. This item will alert John to further need

for a future revision, advise those of you who have the genealogy of the omission, and put the Chappie in touch with John. There's also some work to be done- see the end of the piece.]

NATHAN CHAPMAN, thought to be the son of ISAAC CHAPMAN and Mary BRADFORD, born, by our estimate between 1770 and 1780, married Mehettable BROWN (widow) February 13, 1800. He died July 18, 1804. Mehettable was born May 12, 1776 and she died November 13, 1846. After Nathan's death she married, as his third wife, JOHN FINCH.

I apparently have published information on only one of the children of Nathan and Mehettable. John's genealogy shows Marion's ancestor ELIZABETH CHAPMAN born November 3, 1802 who married William CONNER November 30, 1820. She died December 14, 1891 in Indianapolis, Marion County, Indiana. There were at least two other children of Nathan: AMASA CHAPMAN born December 13, 1800 in New York, died August 1819. NATHAN CHAPMAN born November 3, 1804 in New York, married (1) Phoebe MILLS March 1823 and (2) Emily M. REED January 9, 1833. He was still living in 1862.

RALPH CHAPMAN the son of AZEL CHAPMAN and Nabby HALE, was born February 5, 1802 in Connecticut.

Ralph married (1) Louisa ALGER and (2) Laura TAYLOR.

The family moved from Connecticut to Pennsylvania about 1840. He and his second wife are buried in the Salem Cemetery in Wayne County, Pennsylvania. What was Salem at that time is now known as Hamlin.

The following is a transcription of the document furnished by Cressel L. Chapman.

DWIGHT CHAPMAN, GEORGE CHAPMAN, and EZARIAH CHAPMAN, have released, and do hereby release all our right and title to the administration of said estate, and do hereby request that letters of administration may be granted to Elizer Fessenden, and OLIVE CHAPMAN above named."

Last month she had a stroke or otherwise went into a coma and died several days later. That's the end of that source and leaves me with no prior generation sources for any of my or my wife's family. Mother would have been 90 this month and she and dad would have been married 70 years next May.

Don't put it off any longer than absolutely necessary. If you have parents or aunts, uncles or such still living do all within your means to obtain what they know about your family history while you can. If you don't- when you bury them you bury that information. Maybe you are not even all that interested in the subject at this time. You will likely become interested later- but it may be too late. Why not get it now and save it just in case. If you don't ever want it the chances are your children or grandchildren

will want it some day and they will love you even more for having preserved the information for them.

# **ELECTRONIC CONTACTS**

We continue to find new Chappies almost daily on the Prodigy computer service. Just about every new Chappie brings new Chapman information that may help some present or future Chappie. I'm not keeping score but it seems to me that of all those I work with on Prodigy I am able to contribute some information to just about half of them. That's not to say I help them with any major lineage breakthrough - though that does happen quite often.

You won't find as many entries for these electronic folks in the Chapman Exchange in this issue as before as I was concentrating on something else. Likewise you won't find them in the Chapman Biographic Reference as there I was concentrating on still something else.

# FAMILY GROUP RECORDS

On the front page of the last (#32) issue commented about an effort to acquire more Chapman data and reach more Chappies by purchasing some family group records. That has been a most rewarding experience. I was introduced to the world of genealogy because of some passing comment made by my late dear mother-in-law, DELLA MAE CHAPMAN NEWKIRK. My wife, Mary, and I began over ten years ago tracing her Chapman line. We never got out of Indiana and the 1800's though we did find a suspected connection to North Carolina. One of the almost 100 family group records that I purchased appeared to relate to Mary's Indiana family. As I told you in the previous issue I wrote to all the folks who had submitted the family group sheets (except subscribers). We received a response from this person along with a 69 page compilation of that branch of the family. We are now over in Virginia and well into the 1700's. If there is a moral there folks it is don't

give up. Ten years and many tens of thousands of Chapmans after we started we have finally made a significant personal gain.

Anyway- the next page lists all the folks who had submitted the family group sheets. As promised it shows the names, addresses and ultimate ancestors of those who submitted the records. These are parts of computer records out of my regular Chappie mailing list. It also has the phone number when known and some codes to explain more for those of you who are interested. The work codes (WK) in the first column will tell you this:

RE means they were new to us and have responded to our letter,

PX means we sent the letter and the post office returned as not known or not forwardable, XX means the post office returned our letter with a notation that the person was deceased, g means they were in the program but we have received no response,

CS means they are subscribing Chappies,
CP with a number larger than 000 under ASN
means they are a Chappie who used to be a
subscriber since I resumed publication in 1990,
CP with a 000 under ASN means they are a
Chappie who isn't or has not been a subscriber
since I resumed publication in 1990,
R\$ means this is a new contact who has already
subscribed.

In the next issue I'll have information about the Chapman kin of many of these folks. Maybe you will find something helpful here.

If you have never purchased family group records from the two sources that I used you might consider it for some of your other surnames. I've got the Chapmans so I don't suggest you buy them- just ask me for what you want. I'd always been a little apprehensive about these sources but am now a firm believer-especially for someone in a wholesale surname operation such as I am. I'd also suspected that I would find a lot of duplication between the two sources but that was not the case - though there was a little. I'd also suspected that the only folks I'd find submitting the records would be the ones

ALEXANDER CHAPMAN immigrated to Virginia in 1638; servant to Stephen Charlton of Accomack County.

BENJAMIN CHAPMAN emigrated from Middlesex, England to Virginia on board the ship Friendship in January 1774; age 21; labourer; indentured servant.

EDWARD CHAPMAN dled 1675; emigrated from England to Windsor, Connecticut ca 1660; married to Elizabeth FOX.

HENRY CHAPMAN emigrated from London, England to Carolina on board the ship Carolina in January 1774; age 30; jeweller.

JAMES CHAPMAN emigrated from London, England to Baltimore, Maryland on board the ship Nancy in June 1775; age 23; tin plate worker.

JEFFRY CHAPMAN immigrated to Virginia around 1664.

# THE CHAPMAN FAMILY ASSOCIATION

Those of us presently involved with Chapman family history ought to be doing something to insure that the work we are doing will be preserved and the effort will carry on into the next generation and posterity. Too often a work such as ours dies when one of the key participants dies. I am especially concerned that there be something or someone to assume responsibility for the extensive collection of Chapman information that I have when I'm no longer able to manage it. The vehicle most likely to provide the desired continuity is an association or some such organization.

In the previous issue (#32) I reported that I had sent special packages out to the 20 Chappies who had specifically expressed an interest in starting a CHAPMAN FAMILY ASSOCIATION. I regret to report that the response to that was not encouraging. Only ten of the 20 have responded thus far - makes you wonder huh? I must confess that several of those who did respond were well into their seniority and have paid their dues, so to speak, in this area.

Of the ten- no one wanted to take on the jobs of president, secretary, treasurer, executive director, genealogist, or librarian. Three agreed to serve on the board of directors and two as historian. One offered to work as publicist and

one as editor. One, bless his heart, agreed to try whatever was left over but in a later letter he advised of some major changes in his life that would severely restrict his help with the association.

Most of those who responded were generous though. I've already made a commitment for a unique Chapman family emblem for our group. I'm working with the same person who did the emblem for our Alford group. The Alford emblem has contributed much to the success of our association and I think one will do the same for the Chapmans. Those who responded sent checks contributing \$135 towards the \$350 which we must pay for design and art work involved with the emblem. We will receive both color and black and white camera ready versions of the emblem with an overlay with the name of our association and our founding date. Whatever the shortfall in the fund to pay for the emblem will be made up by me personally. The response sheet that was received with this issue provides space for you to make a donation towards the payment for this emblem.

Because we did not have persons offering to assume leadership roles in an association I propose that we continue with the plan to establish an association but do it more slowly and on an informal and unofficial basis. We will not be chartered or incorporated in any state, we will not have any financial accounts or standing and no tax implications, we will have no formal leadership and no officers. We will have a name, an emblem, and a group of unstructured people working together on Chapmans - a work that will cease when we are deceased; unless, we get organized before we do.

We do need your help in selecting a name for the association - informal now but hopefully well organized eventually. The response sheet received with this issue has a space for you to vote on or recommend a name for the association. Keep in mind that whatever it is named the chances are good that it will be called by initials or an acronym more often than

not. Our Alford American Family Association is known to most of us a AAFA. While I received only ten responses I received about twice as many name suggestions. One suggestion, coming from a relatively new Chappie and one not on board in time to receive the organization package sent to potential founders, is that we consider relating to the Chapman Family Historical Association that existed about 100 years ago (see CC #27 pg 30; CC #28 pgs 1 & 36; CC #29 pg 1, 5 & 6; CC #30 pg 1). By so doing he thinks we might be able to show on our letterhead, masthead, or whatever "established 1892" or established over 100 years ago.

Most of those responding thought we ought to do something about planning annual or periodic Chappie meetings or Chapman family reunions. There is a question about that on the response form also.

### CHAPMAN FAMILY REUNIONS

Speaking of reunions in the last articlelast year we were advised of plans to hold two different Chapman family reunions. We worked with the Chappies involved with those two groups in hopes of furthering interest in our over all Chapman research.

One of the things that I did was break with a long standing rule pertaining to recording descendants with surnames other than Chapman. In both cases I prepared computerized genealogies listing all the known descendants of the progenitor or central subject of the reunion group. We also offered special assistance and reduced subscription costs for those of the groups who would like to become involved with us. Like so many family reunion groups these folks apparently wanted to remain separate and work on their own. No one was added to our bunch from either of the groups.

The Chappie working with one of these groups was Joseph W. Dix. He provided extensive data on those he knew in this branch of the family and was most cooperative in our effort. I've published a copy of the genealogy prepared for his group in this issue. It starts on

the next page. I expect to continue to publish small genealogies in this format in future issues.

You may be involved with a Chapman family reunion group. If you would like to work with me on a computerized genealogy of that group- unless you already have one of you own-then I'll be happy to prepare and publish a similar one for your branch. This takes a lot of time, coordination, and work so we must start many months in advance of your meeting.

### CHAPMAN CENSUS PROJECT

I cannot believe the progress we are making in this area. In the previous issue (#32) you saw the list of Chapmans in the 1810 census along with the tabulation by age group and sex. We had previously published 1790 and 1800.

We are well on our way with the 1820 census. Thanks to several of you we now have all the index data for Chapmans in 1820 that we need. Extraction of the details from the microfilm has been completed on three states. Four other states are in process. We need help in extracting the data for the following states: Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Indiana, Maine, Massachusetts, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Vermont, and Virginia.

If you have access to the 1820 census microfilm then we can make the extraction process painless as described in the next piece on page 29. Most of you probably live within in driving distance of a Mormon (LDS) Family History Center (FHC). If you do then you can arrange with them to use the microfilm. If they don't have it they can have it added to their local collection long enough for you to extract the data you need. Contrary to the understanding of some folks the LDS church collects information on all persons - regardless of religion, race, creed, etc. and they make their resources available to all who care to use them. You may spend an eon in a FHC and unless you are

# ENDNOTES JOSEPH CHAPMAN 1794 SC

- 1 Most of the information for this lineage came from Mr. Joseph W. Dix, 2806 Wisconsin Avenue, Joplin MO 69804. He cited an application for a War of 1812 pension as the source for much of the information on Joseph and his wife. Another known descendant and source of some of the information is Mrs. Francis E. Horn, 604 Thompson Drive, El Reno, OK 73036.
- 12 Joseph W. Dix wrote, "Theophilus Chapman died in Wash Co. VA yet we have found where his estate was probated in Texas Co. MO where it is said he owned property."
- 14 Mrs. Francis E. (Lois) Horn's husband is a great grandson of Melvina and Joel Horn / Horne. Lois provided information on about 20 other Washington County Chapmans taken from cemetery records published in "High on a Windy Hill". No connection has been made with these Chapmans and those in this branch of the family. Lois also provided information from the 1850 census of Russell Co. VA which was the source for some of the data in this lineage.
- 17 Joseph W. Dix wrote, "After Theophilus death his son, Joseph Wesley, was brought to Texas Co. MO and reared by his grandparents Wesley Dickenson and Susan Ray Dickenson-the parents of Jerusha Ellington Dickenson." On another occasion he wrote, "Joseph Welsey was left an orphan at 2 yrs of age . ."
- 21 Mr. Joseph W. Dix wrote, "Ark 1910 census show Lula Gertrude Chapman born in MO. She has always told us she was born in Jonesboro, Ark. To this date we have not been able to prove the correct birth location nor have we been able to obtain a copy of her marriage license."

prone to run at the mouth no one will ever know of your religion - or the lack of it. There is a place on the response form for you to offer to help with this extraction.

We have most of the index data required for 1830-1850. Here is a list of what we still need in case you have access to any census index publications and are willing to help. You'll find them in most good genealogical libraries. Arizona 1850, Maryland 1840, Massachusetts 1830 & 1840, Minnesota 1850, Mississippi 1830 & 1840, Missouri 1830 & 1840, New Hampshire 1830, Oregon 1850, Rhode Island 1830 & 1840, Tennessee 1840, Utah 1850, Vermont 1830, Virginia 1830 & 1840. We still need most of the 1860, 1870 and to the extent it exists 1880 and later indexes for all states. There is a place on the response sheet for you to offer to help with these indexes.

# CENSUS EXTRACTION PROCESS 1800-1840

We have devised a system that almost makes this census extraction a pleasure. If you have done this before you know you have to find an index to learn whose listed, the counties where they are located and the page number of the microfilm where they are supposed to be found. Armed with that bit of information you then begin to try to find out the reference for the reel of microfilm that you need to search. Assuming you succeed in that and get the microfilm loaded you quickly learn that the microfilm is arranged by page number (based on the sequence of the enumeration) and the index is in alphabetical order. If you overcome that and find your subject you then must write on your form or paper ALL of the pertinent data from the microfilm- including the name, state, county, township, page number, census tabulation, and whatever. If you've done much of this I can understand why you would hesitate to volunteer for census extraction- but wait!
