On the 1870 census her name is given as Lafair or Lafain (?)

Notes for Valentine Whelchel:
A Whelchel story from the Civil War:

Valentine Whelchel of New Bridge in northwest Hall County enlisted in the Confederate Army even though his father was one of seven delegates who opposed Georgia's secession from the Union. On June 3, 1863, Valentine was trying to recapture some artillery guarded by the 9th Michigan Cavalry at Brandywine. He got into a sword fight with a Union soldier, Louis Metzger, and was slashed on the head and hand. Though wounded, he eventually was able to capture Metzger and sent him to the rear as a prisoner before getting treated for his injuries.

After the war, Whelchel moved to Texas and was looking for a surveyor to survey his farm. He came across his next door neighbor, who turned out to be Metzger, the former Union soldier whom he had fought with and captured. They became best friends and lived side by side for five years until Whelchel returned to Hall County. He left his Texas farm under the watch of Metzger.

Whelchel told the Atlanta Constitution in July 1892, "The politicians made the war while the jeans and butternuts did the fighting. There are no better friends than those who wore the Blue and Gray from 1861 to 1865 fighting the politicians' battles."

Whelchel said he still had the scars to prove his skirmish with Metzger.

On the 1880 census, they have Lenora Spillman living in the home with the family. She is 12 years old. Who were the Spillmans and why are the children with the Whelchels? The census says she is Valentine's niece.

She was born on 22 May 1826 in South Carolina. She died on 09 Jun 1910 in Hall Co, GA. He married Anna Lee on 29 Oct 1901 in Baptist Parsonage, Scio, OR. She was born in 1851 in Missouri. He married Martha Ann. She was born on 22 May 1846 in Georgia. She died on 19 Jul 1894 in Scio, OR.

Notes for Joseph L. Chapman:

In 1870, Hall Co - the family has a white domestic helper named Tallulah J King aged 21.

The family is in the Polksville District, HH# 667/590.

Joseph L. is a farmer & minister, age 47.

In 1880, Joseph L Chapman and brother Thomas are living in Oregon with new wives. Two children born in Oregon in 1879. Thomas is married Tallulah Jane who was born in Georgia in 1849. Joseph's birthdate is June 1823. He has a son Lee who was born in Sept 1879 in Oregon and daughter Minnie who was born in April 1882 in Oregon.

In 1880 Thomas is listed as farm labor and in 1900 he is a physician! But his daughter in Georgia listed him as a physician.

He married Anna Mespelt age 50 when he was 77 in Linn Co, OR.

In 1882, J.L. Chapman is in the Scio Business Directory under Groceries and Liquor Stores.

In 1910 He and Anna are living in Santa Rosa, Sonoma Co, CA. He says he and his parents were born in SC. On a previous census she said she was born in

Missouri this one says Iowa. He is 86 years old and lists his occupation as farmer. She is 60. Both say they have been married twice. (He has actually been married 3 times - having abandoned his family in GA)

Franklin Butte Masonic cemetery.
Simple tombstone simply engraved Joseph L. Chapman 1823-1912.

The person who provided information for his death certificate was F. Mispelt. Nothing was filled in for his birthplace or parents. His date of birth was provided June 23, 1823. He died of apoplexy at the age of 88 years 7 months and 9 days. I wonder if he had regrets for abandoning his family in Georgia.

Findagrave.com has a copy of his death certificate. The person providing the information did not know his birthplace, parents' names or where they were from. Sad ending to a selfish man.

Notes for Emaline Covington:

The 1880 census shows her as married. Did Joseph leave his wife and family to start over in Oregon?

In 1910, Emmaline is listed as a widow. Her daughter Hannah lives with her. Emmaline had 9 children but only 4 are living.

Phillip M Byrd's will mentions his niece Emeline H Chapman and nephew Joseph t? Chapman. I believe this should be Joseph L Chapman who was Phillip Byrd's nephew by marriage (I think)

148 GA 839, Boyd et al v Sanders et al (no. 807) Supreme Court of Georgia Feb 24 1919

1. Deeds 38(1), 41, 112(1) Validity - Description

Third item of Philip M. Byrd's will devised to his wife Mary for life all of his estate both real and personal or mixed. The ninth item provided for Emeline M. Chapman's sole and separate use for and during her natural life - this property was that mentioned in item 3 that was to be conveyed to his wife Mary after her estate is over. After Emeline's death, it was to pass to her representatives and children in equal shares including her husband Joseph L. Chapman.

The court became involved when Emeline's married daughter Fannie Suddeth operated as though she had the right to use her share of the property even though her mother was still alive. Then to complicate it further, Fannie died and her husband and children continued to sell the property as though it was theirs - though Emeline was still alive. They didn't understand the part about "after Emeline dies".

Philip M. Chapman's death cert says his mother's maiden name was Garner! ???

Notes for Anna Lee:

She was a widow - shown as Mrs. Anna Mespelt, age 50

The license witness was I.A. Munkers. The wedding witnesses were Minnie Chapman and Mrs. A.M. Davis. Performed at the Baptist Parsonage, by W.W. Davis, minister.

In 1900, Anna stated that she had 10 children, 10 living in 1900

In 1880, William F. Mespelt age 28, wife Anna, age 30 born in Missouri, parents born in Europe. Children are: Anna age 7 born in Iowa, Levina age 3 born in Iowa and Freddie (son) age 1, born in Iowa.

Thanks to findagrave.com and contributor for providing death cert for one of their children - William J. Mespelt - her maiden name was Lee. William J. died in 1956 in Linn Co.

Notes for Martha Ann:

According to her daughter, Anna's, death notice in 1896, she died of TB. Her middle initial may be N but honestly I think it is an A - either standing for Ann or perhaps maiden name Anderson?

Notes for Davis Whelchel:

Davis Whelchel, born Dec. 2, 1811, died Oct. 10, 1889. Major in 94th Battalion, Hall County, Georgia Militia, March 30, 1840. Member of Secession Convention, Hall County. Member Continental Convention, Hall County. Representative, Hall County, 1868, Georgia House of Representatives, and also served extra in 1869 to 1870. He was married (first) March 25, 1836, to Cynthia Cowan who died Jan. 5, 1855. He was married (second) Jan. 28, 1856 to Mary Chapman who was born Feb. 10, 1827, died Aug. 14, 1910. (Sybil McCray - Hall County, GA Genealogist)

They have an adopted child in 1880 - 9 year old Millie Spillman.

In 1860, the Com. School Teacher lived with the family - E.V. Gailey, 25 years old, female.

Was Davis, Sr. his father?

The Eagle (Gainesville?) reported that the home of Major Davis Whelchel burned with all its contents causing a loss of between \$3 and \$4 thousand dollars on or about March 17, 1875. This was printed in the Georgia Weekly Telegraph and Georgia Journal & Messenger (Macon, GA) on March 23, 1875.

The Eagle reported: A Yankee schoolmaster has been living for some time at uncle Dave Whelchel's, in this county. He is very much interested in the welfare of the colored people of the South, and spends much of his time in talking to and advising the poor unfortunates. A few days ago he "interviewed" Si. Chapman, a worthy old negro in the employ of Major Whelchel, at considerable length. He asked Si. all about his prospects, hopes and anticipations, spiritually and financially, and evinced more than ordinary interest in his welfare. Si. heard him patiently, and then remarked to him, "You's a Yankee, I spose?" "Yes, sir, I suppose I am what the Southern white people would call a Yankee. I am from Kansas, one of the Northwestern States." "Well," said Si., "you Yankees put me in mind of a bumblebee. Dat bug buzzes and sings 'round your head till he stings you, den he's gone in a minit, and you hear no more from him. Dat's de way you fellows do." the Georgia Weekly Telegraph and Georgia Journal & Messenger (Macon, GA) on June 15, 1875.

- v. Sarah Chapman was born on 16 Jan 1829 in Hall Co, GA. She married Thomas Rives. He was born on 22 Nov 1835. He died on 18 May 1862 in Atlanta, GA.

Notes for Thomas Rives:

Notes for Harriet K. Chapman:

Harriett is shown as head of family in 1870 - living in Atlanta, GA with her children, George 19, Emaline, 13, Olive 11, John 9, and James 7. Nearby is brother George.

In 1880, she is still living in Fulton County with youngest two sons, John and James. She is a farmer and they work on the farm.

Notes for John F. Rives:

sometimes spelled Reives

Rives, John F. (or Reives) - Captain March 10, 1862.

Resigned September 21, 1862 or December 23, 1862.

Reenlisted, command not stated. Killed at Vicksburg, Miss. July 3, 1863.

Chapman, Thomas K. -- Private - August 24, 1861. Elected Jr. 2nd Lieutenant March 8, 1862; 2nd Lieutenant July 20, 1862; 1st Lieutenant December 23, 1862; Captain March 31, 1864 Wounded at Wilderness, Virginia May 6, 1864. Assigned to duty as 2nd Lieutenant of Company E, 11th Regiment Georgia Cavalry September 6, 1864. Granted leave of absence for 30 days January 27, 1865. Dates of promotion conflict with those of W. F. Parks. No later record. (Born in 1835.)

In 1870, the household consists of Thomas K. Chapman age 34, born in GA wife Amanda R. Chapman age 26 born in SC daughters Alice, Emma, Ellen and apparently Thomas K. Chapman's mother, Marium Chapman, age 69, born in South Carolina.

It appears that he went with his brother Joseph L Chapman to Oregon about 1877 or 78. He has a wife Tallulah Jane and daughter Tallulah in Oregon in 1880. He says he is a physician on the 1900 census. Last appears on the 1900 census in Linn Co, Oregon.

Don't know if it belongs to THIS Thomas Chapman but there is a death certificate for a Thomas Chapman filed in Portland with no county listed with a date of 4/9/1904.

Confusing because he seems to be on the 1880 GA census with his family. Except the age given is incorrect by about 5 years. This census says he is 40 - he is actually about 45. It appears that the brothers simply left their families and never looked back. No divorce. Just abandonment.

1900 Census says he was born in October 1835. He says he has been married once and has been married for 21 years. So, based on the census, both Joseph and Thomas K Chapman never married until they were in their 40s or 50s.

Notes for Amanda R. Garner:

In 1900 Amanda is shown as head of family and married - not widowed. Only Ida remains in the home.

In 1910, Amanda is living with her now married daughter Ida. Amanda states she had 4 children, 3 are living. Ida was the 2nd wife of James M Haynes. Ida has had one child - daughter Loraine now 5 years old.

Ok - I've got a mystery here to unravel - I found a death certificate for Mrs. Amanda Chapman which gave the following information.

Clermont, Hall County

Widowed white female, dob Nov 4, 1844

age 76 4 mos 23 days at death on Jan 28 1920

She was born in Pickens County, SC

Her father was John Garner and her mother was Nancy Goode!

Birthplace of father not known, birthplace of mother South Carolina.

So why is she shown as Amanda Rives? Was she the widow of Rives when she married husband Dr. T.K. Chapman

Or was Amanda Rives the one who married Thomas L. Chapman?

She died of brocho pneumonia.

Her death certificate says she is MARRIED not widowed.

1880 census shows Thomas K Chapman head of household age 40 farmer
wife Amandy R Chapman age 35

Notes for Tallulah Jane King:

In 1900, they are living next door to Joseph L Chapman family. Tallulah is shown as Jane as states she had 2 children but only 1 is living.

- ix. Phillip B. Chapman was born on 05 Mar 1837 in Hall Co, GA. He died on 16 May 1863 in Bakers Creek, MS. He married Mavel Waters. She was born about 1834.

Notes for Phillip B. Chapman:

Interesting a will was filed in 1862 and executed in 1864 (I think these dates are right. I know I've seen the abstract of the will)

He wrote Being of sound mind and disposing memory knowing uncertain life and that at any hour I may depart this life. He wrote this December 9, 1862 and died May 16, 1863.

Served as Private in Company " K "

43rd. Georgia Infantry Regiment

HALL COUNTY, GEORGIA

BROWN'S BOYS

Chapman, Phillip B.- private March 10, 1862. Killed at Baker's Creek, Miss. May 16, 1863.

Notes for Mavel Waters:

In 1880, Mavel is a widow. In the home is Mary age 20, Thomas age 19 and neice Amanda age 21.

- x. George Chapman was born on 18 Jan 1841 in Hall Co, GA. He died on 08 May

1911 in Fulton County, Georgia. He married Laura Beecher Thompson on 03 Feb 1863 in Hall Co, GA. She was born on 19 Sep 1845. She died on 12 Nov 1937 in Fulton County, Georgia.

Notes for George Chapman:

I think the transcriber just may have misread the middle initial as an R when it was actually an S for Sears. If so, this information pertains:

Co.G 24TH Regiment
"White County Marksmen"

Private - August 24, 1861. Severely wounded at Wilderness, Virginia May 6, 1864. In hospital August 1864. At home, wounded, close of war.

May be his middle name was NOT Sears but something beginning with R. The 1880 census has him near his sister Harriet's family in Buckhead, Fulton Co, GA. If I wasn't sure, then the fact that he has one of the Spillman orphans living with him in 1880 really adds more evidence. Nancy F. Spillman, niece, age 13 lives with the George R chapman family.

16. **Joseph Chapman** was born on 25 Dec 1745 in Halifax Co, VA. He died on 18 Jan 1836 in Pickens Co, SC. He married **Mary**.

17. **Mary** was born about 1745. She died between 1831-1836 in Pickens Co, SC.

Mary and Joseph Chapman had the following children:

- i. Nancy Chapman was born about 1769 in Guilford Co, NC. She died after 1850 in Lumpkin Co, GA. She married John Patterson Jr.. He died before 1810 in Pendleton Dist, SC.

Notes for Nancy Chapman:

1850 census - Lumpkin Co living in the home of James and Elizabeth Cantrell. Elizabeth is Nancy's daughter.

Don't know who Hannah married.

- ii. William Chapman was born about 1772 in Guilford Co, NC. He died about 1836 in Vanderburgh Co, IN. He married Dorcas about 1793 in Pendleton District, SC. She was born about 1772. She died between 1836-1840 in Vanderburgh Co, IN.

Notes for William Chapman:

Vanderburgh Co, IN Book B, page 152. 29 Aug 1829 ...William and Dorcas Chapman gave all of their estate, real and personal to the sons, Joseph and James, in turn for the care of the parents, etc.

1800 Pendleton District #620 - Has two boys under 10 yrs. He and Dorcas are at least sixteen but less than twentysix yrs old.

1810 Pendleton District - Has two boys and two girls under 10 (Mary & Violet), one boy 10 to 16 and he and Dorcas are 26 to 45.

1820 Vanderburgh Co, IN - William lived next door to Joseph Chapman (son who married Ibby Henson). Next door to Joseph is John Henson Sr.

1820 there is one boy under 10, one male 16 under 18, and William 45 yrs or older, also one girl 10 under 16 and wife Dorcas 45 yrs or older.

In 1830 - John Henson Sr lived next door to William Sr. Henson was older - 60-70 yrs old.

- iii. John Chapman was born about 1774 in Guilford Co, NC. He died in 1850 in Pickens Co, SC. He married Christiana Hubbard. She was born about 1775 in NC. Notes for John Chapman:

1810 Pendleton District - he has two boys and one girl under ten, one boy and one girl 10 to 16, and it appear the census taker checked the wrong column and put him in the 45 up column. Christiana is correctly placed in th 26 to 45. Three slaves.

- iv. Jeremiah Chapman was born about 1776. He married Betsy. He married Betsy Gibson in Kentucky.
- v. Elizabeth Chapman was born about 1778 in Guilford Co, NC. She died after 1836 in Smith Co, TN. She married George McGee. He was born before 1775. He died in Smith Co, TN. She married William Boze.
- vi. Joseph Chapman Jr. was born about 1782. He married Mary?.

Notes for Joseph Chapman Jr.:

John, Thomas and Betsy Chapman, sons and daughter of Joseph Chapman, appoint William Lynch their attorney. All of the above were residents of Simpson County, Kentucky at this time. William Lynch was instructed to "sue for their proportioned parts of the said Joseph Chapman's, deceased, our Grandfather's estate.

Signed February 18, 1837, Town of Franklin, Simpson County, Kentucky.

(Nancy and Mary, named below, were unmarried minors when the estate was settled. But regardless of her age, a person was considered of legal age when he or she married. So, whether they were legally of age or whether their guardian allowed them to marry before reached legal age, they could then receive their share.

Received December 24, 1841 of Miles C. Norton, \$42.81 in full of the distributive share of Nancy Hightower, formerly Nancy Chapman, daughter of Joseph Chapman, Jr. and her husband, Hemington Hightower, and Elbert Penbrook, in behalf of his children, the heirs of Mary Penbrook, formerly Mary Chapman.

- vii. Unknown Chapman was born about 1784. She married Solomon McGee.

Notes for Solomon McGee:

In 1810, Solomon lives two households from Joseph. They have two boys under 10. There are two women in the house 16 to 26, one woman 26 to 45 (his mother and a sister?) and Solomon is 26 to 45.

In 1820, Solomon and wife are in Smith County, TN. They have one boy and three girls under 10, one boy 10 to 16, one boy 16 to 18 and Solomon is 45 and up, his wife is 26 to 45.

- viii. Enoch Chapman was born about 1785. He married unknown.

Notes for Enoch Chapman:

1810, living next door to William Chapman. Enoch has one child, a daughter. In 1810 the girl is under 10 years old.

Also he and William are just one household away from their nephew Joseph Patterson and next door to him is there widowed sister, Nancy (Chapman) Patterson.

Enoch is in the 16-26 age range and his brother William is in the 26 - 45 age range.
