
As a former subscriber to CHAPMAN CHATTER, I am glad to hear that you are resuming publication. My original query concerned my great-grandfather THOMAS CHAPMAN born in Stark County, OH. Your files probably include my family record. Recently I identified "my" THOMAS CHAPMAN, whose birth was 3 April, 1814, in Stark County, Ohio. His known siblings are: JOSEPH CHAPMAN b. 25 Oct 1801, BETSEY CHAPMAN b. 12 Aug 1804, WILLIAM CHAPMAN b. 20 Sep 1807 and JOHN CHAPMAN b. 10 Aug 1809. Their father was THOMAS CHAPMAN, who died in 1814 (possibly Oct.) in Stark County, Ohio. His widow was Polly (Mary) _____?. The family was in Stark County by 1810. It is possible that they came from Beaver County, Pennsylvania. My earlier query had shown THOMAS CHAPMAN'S birth year as 1819, as I read it in Civil War enlistment records. Currently I am interested in learning about: the ancestry of THOMAS CHAPMAN (Sr.); Polly Chapman's maiden name and ancestry; later information about the siblings of Thomas (Jr.). Stark County real estate tax records indicate that Polly Chapman probably moved out of Stark County within four or five years after her husband's death. Taxes were paid under her name at least through 1829, according to the Stark County tax duplicates, but she was listed as "out of Stark." Thank you for any additional information that you or your subscribers can provide me. Dorothy Cornwell (#081) has a Chapman ancestor who was born in Stark County, OH, but I can see no connection. She thinks her family came from New Jersey while Mary is looking back to Pennsylvania. The Chapmans in Mary's inquiry can also be found in the Biographical Reference Listing. -Gil.

I am glad to hear that you are resuming the publication of the CHAPMAN CHATTER. I am enclosing the "Chapman Family Worksheet" which takes the family line back to Guilford Twn, New Haven Co, Conn. (I'm sorry my previous abbreviation was unclear.) Hoopeston, Vermillion Co., IL was the burial place of most of my Iroquois Co. IL relatives since Lovejoy Twn is 5-6 miles NW of Hoopeston. Does this correction of location- Conn instead of Canada and the family genealogy to the 3rd great grandfather assist in the identification in your computer files? And then a later letter-

Thank you for the information on ADONIJAH CHAPMAN that you have been able to glean from your resources. I had not been able to visit a genealogical library since I had received the Adonijah information from the LDS-IGI. I can appreciate your comments about "gillions" of Chapmans in Connecticut. Adonijah had 7 children according to his will. son, PETER CHAPMAN, had 14 children of which DARIUS CHAPMAN was #8 according to a biographical sketch of Darius in a Iroquois County, IL history book for that period. I have no names for any of the 14 children except Darius. I have recently joined the New England Historic Genealogical Society in Boston who have a book on loan service tht I hope to use both for the Chapmans in the Guilford area and the Whites from the same area.

Lucy Savage White was the wife of Darius and family tradition has it that her ancestors go back to the Mayflower. A brother of Lucy was suppose to have married a sister of Darius but I have no names to hang on to yet. We shall see. I am enclosing the Pedigree Charts and the Extended Ancestor Tables for the Chapman Chatter. Could you send me another blank Four Generation Ancestor Chart so that I can make copies for my future use. Thanks. The printed information on my Chapmans looks fine to me. Thanks for sharing. I am looking forward to the forthcoming issue of the newsletter.

About nine years ago I purchased one- and now am an authority on them - Ha! Ha! It certainly does not hurt to study the subject of computers before you buy. One must determine what they want to do with a computer and then purchase one to do that job. Don't

fail to overlook growth and discovery of new things to do with the computer. I would think that most folks- unless you plan an operation similar to mine- could do with an inexpensive IBM clone or IBM compatible machine. If you can afford it get an AT system or one using the 80286 microprocessor. If you want to keep it inexpensive then you can do with a XT system or one using the 8088 microprocessor. In either case get a harddisk- about 40 meg (that's 40 million bits of information) and two floppy disk hi-density Don't let someone tell you drives. that you need one of the newer 386 or 386SX systems. It does not cost too much more to get a color monitor and it is certainly easier to use. One can purchase any number of brands of inexpensive dot-matirx printers and it is foolish to buy a computer for genealogy and not buy a printer (I know some folks who have not). More important than the price and hardware considerations though is a problem you will have personally. Are you willing to dedicate considerable hours learning the hardware and the software? Don't let these high-pressure computer salesmen fool you. They being Thomas P. Chapman, Harvey C. Chapman and second wife to Thomas, Martha Peabody. Have no real proof of Thomas P. Chapman parents but in the IGI file there is a Thomas Chapman born 12 September 1791 North Stonington, CT. I have sent for source of these records to find out who turned in the information on Thomas Chapman 12 September 1791. Could not find war record of Thomas P. Chapman even though he has a land warrent from the government for military service. Also tried to find Harvey C. She was listed once living in the house of Nepolian B. Jones in Wapello Twp. Her birthplace given as OH and she was 16 yrs old. The other listing was as the wife of Benjamin F. Ellis, born in OH, and still 16 years old. They lived in Grandview Twp. JEREMIAH CHAPMAN age 12, born in OH was listed in the house of Benjamin and Harriet. I did not run across a Thomas, but did find two others. JAMES CHAPMAN 23, born in OH was living in the house of Joshua Marshall in Wapello Twp., and MADI-SON CHAPMAN 15, born in OH, was living in the house of David P. Herron, in Grandview Twp. It would seem logical that all of the above were of one family, and that they had been orphaned. I did not search for death or guardian records. Benjamin F. Ellis came out of a Quaker family. I am not sure about the Chapmans although I do
